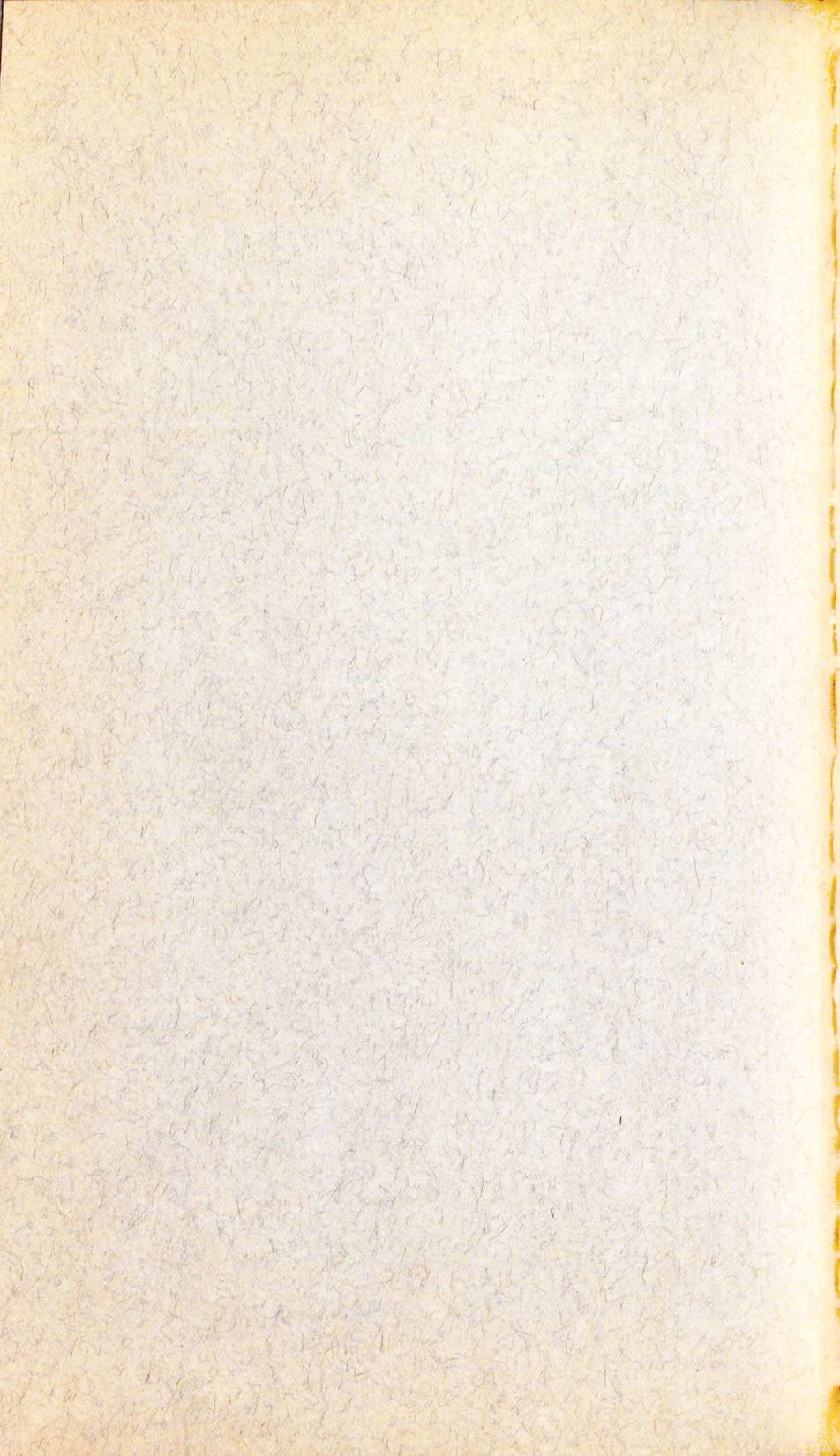

## UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH

## FOREWORD

The provisions of this bulletin are not to be regarded as an irrevocable contract between the University and the student. The University reserves the right to change any provision or requirement at any time within the student's time of residence. The University further reserves the right, upon refunding to the student his tuition, to ask him to withdraw for cause at any time.

## HISTORY

The University of Pittsburgh was founded by charter from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as Pittsburgh Academy on February 28, 1787, to provide higher education in western Pennsylvania. Throughout its history, it has been partly supported by the state, in partnership with the public-spirited citizens of Pittsburgh. In 1819, a second charter was granted, making the Western University of Pennsylvania the legal successor of the Pittsburgh Academy.

Until the last decade of the nineteenth century, the University gave little but collegiate and engineering training; but in 1890-1892, new buildings were erected on Observatory Hill, Allegheny, and a number of professional schools were organized or affiliated with the University. In 1908, the University purchased the present campus in Oakland, the educational and civic center of Pittsburgh, and the name was changed to the University of Pittsburgh, as being more appropriate to the community it serves. The institution thus has had in its various forms a continuous history of 143 years. Since 1910, the University has grown from 1,200 resident students to more than 12,000. About 6,500 of these are full-time students. It has a faculty of 1,000 persons, and annually confers more than 1,200 degrees in course. The great majority of its 15,000 living alumni practice their professions and make their homes in western Pennsylvania. A more complete history will be found in the General Catalog.

## ORGANIZATION

The University of Pittsburgh includes the following schools and divisions: The College, Schools of Engineering, Mines, Business Administration, Education, Graduate School, Schools of Medicine, Law, Pharmacy, Dentistry, Allegheny Observatory, Summer Session, Mellon Institute of Industrial Research, University Extension Division, Downtown Division, Research Bureau for Retail Training, Radio Studio, and the Division of Research in Higher Education.

## RADIO STUDIO

The University Radio Studio of station KDKA is maintained on the campus through the cooperation of the Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing Company. The programs for the most part are talks given by members of the faculty and guest speakers. Hundreds of letters received at the studio indicate that the radio campus extends over both of the American continents and across the Atlantic Ocean to Russia and beyond and even in South Africa, Java, China, and India.

## THE SCHOOL OF LAW

The first professorship in law in the University was created in 1843 with the appointment of the Honorable Walter H. Lowrie of the class of 1826, later Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, as Professor of Law; and courses in law were conducted until about 1850.

In 1862, the vacant professorship in law was filled by the appointment of the Honorable Moses Hampton, President Judge of the District Court of Allegheny County. He was succeeded the following year by Henry Williams, Esq., subsequently a justice of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, who delivered lectures in law until 1870, when they were again discontinued.

The School of Law was organized as a department of the old Western University under the name of the Pittsburgh Law School in October, 1895, with the late Honorable John D. Shafer as Dean. With the granting of the new charter in 1908 the Pittsburgh Law School became the School of Law of the University of Pittsburgh.

## LOCATION

The School of Law is located on the tenth floor of the Chamber of Commerce Building, Pittsburgh. Its quarters are in the downtown section, near the City-County Building and Allegheny County Court House, where the Court of Common Pleas, the Orphans' Court, and the County Court of Allegheny County are quartered and where the Supreme and Superior Courts of Pennsylvania meet each year, when sitting in this district. It is also near the Federal Building, where the District Court of the United States is held.

Pittsburgh is excelled by few cities in its advantages for both the study and the practice of law. By reason of the mercantile and manufacturing supremacy of Pittsburgh and the vast number and extent of its industries, litigation is more varied in character and more important than in most jurisdictions. The Common Pleas Court, which has fourteen judges; the Orphans' Court, having three judges; the County Court, with six judges; together with the United States and the Appellate State Courts, give the student exceptional opportunities to familiarize himself with court practice.

## CLASSES

The Classes of the School of Law are held from 9:30 in the morning until 4:40 in the afternoon. No classes are held at night.

## ADMISSION

Candidates for admission to the School of Law are required to submit evidence of having received a bachelor's degree, after the completion of a four-year course in an approved college or university.

Students who expect to practice in Pennsylvania must register with the State Board of Law Examiners upon the commencement of their legal studies.

While a senior in college the prospective law student should communicate with Walter C. Douglass, Secretary of the State Board of Law Examiners, 1500 Walnut Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for a copy of the rules for registration, and for the necessary blanks. It should be noted that new rules became effective January 1, 1928, under which the procedure for registration has been materially changed. Students during their period of registration with the State Board as law students and before admission to the Bar must spend at least six months of full-time study in the office of a preceptor, an attorney of the county in which they propose to practice.

All new students are required to file with the Registrar of the Law School, prior to registration week, a certificate of graduation from their college or university.

*Advanced Standing.* An applicant for admission to any other than the first-year class of the School of Law must present satisfactory evidence of having been in regular attendance for the number of years for which credit is asked, at a law school whose standing is satisfactory to the faculty of this School, and of having satisfactorily completed the courses of study required in that institution during those years. The applicant must also comply with the entrance requirements of this School as to preliminary education. Admission to advanced standing is subject to such conditions as the circumstances require in order to adjust the courses of study.

All candidates for admission to the School must use the form of application prescribed by the faculty.

The School of Law of the University of Pittsburgh is a member of the Association of American Law Schools and all its rules are to be read in harmony with the rules of that Association.

## DEGREES

On completing the full course of study prescribed by the faculty, a student is granted the degree of Bachelor of Laws.

## TUITION AND FEES

The annual tuition in the School of Law is \$300.00, payable in two installments, \$150.00 upon registration at the opening of the first semester and \$150.00 upon registration for the second semester.

The tuition entitles the student to admission to all athletic events under the auspices of the University and to certain other events under the jurisdiction of the Advisory Board of Student Activities.

A fee of \$5.00 is added to the tuition if registration is not completed within the dates specified.

A fee of \$5.00 is charged for each special examination or re-examination.

A graduation fee of \$10.00 is payable before graduation by each candidate for a degree.

## REFUNDS

Students who withdraw from the University for a satisfactory reason before the end of the eighth week of the semester may request a proportionate refund of tuition. Application for a refund will be considered only when made at the time of withdrawal.

RULES OF THE FACULTY IN REGARD TO GRADING  
AND EXAMINATIONS

1. All examinations are conducted according to the honor system, under the control of the student body. As a condition of admission in signing application, students agree to support the honor system of conducting examination which is in force in this School.

2. The minimum grade required in every course for passing is sixty per cent. To complete a year's work a student is required to pass every course, to make a general average of sixty-five per cent, and to attend eighty per cent of the lectures and recitations in each course for the year.

3. In computing the general average, credit is given to courses according to approximate number of hours.

4. Students receive grades by letter as follows:

85-100	.....	A
75-84	.....	B
65-74	.....	C
60-64	.....	D
Below 60	.....	E

5. Students having an average of "A" for the entire course receive their degrees "with honor."

6. A student who fails to pass not more than two courses given during the year may continue with his class, provided he satisfactorily passes reexaminations in the subjects in which he is deficient

before the first day of the next academic year, and attains, after such reexaminations, a general average of sixty-five per cent for the entire year. Reexaminations will be given only on dates scheduled by the Registrar.

7. A student who fails to attain the general average of sixty-five per cent for the year, but who has passed each course during the year with a grade of sixty per cent or more, may continue with his class on satisfactorily passing, before the first day of the next Academic year, reexaminations in the three subjects in which his grades are lowest, thus raising his average to sixty-five per cent for the year. Reexaminations will be given only on dates scheduled by the Registrar.

8. A student who fails in three or more subjects during the year, or who fails to remove conditions when required, shall not be permitted to remain in the School, except that a student may enter the second-year class conditioned in one first-year subject.

#### CONDUCT

The faculty of the School of Law reserves the right to exclude at any time students whose conduct or academic standing it regards as undesirable, and in such cases the fees due or which may have been paid in advance to the School will not be refunded or remitted in whole or in part.

#### BULLETIN BOARD

A bulletin board is maintained on which all official notices are posted, and such notices are considered personal notices to the student or students concerned.

#### MOOT COURT AND STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

Each student in the School is required to take part in at least one moot court argument during each year. Inter-Fraternity and Law Club arguments are conducted in competition for the 1925 Cup. The Cup was won in 1927-1928 by Tau Epsilon Rho.

There are six national legal fraternities and three law clubs in the School: Phi Delta Phi, Delta Theta Phi, Phi Alpha Delta, Phi Delta Delta (women's), Tau Epsilon Rho, Lambda Alpha Phi, the Women's Law Club, the Marshall Law Club, and the Webster Law Club.

#### FELLOWSHIP

At the close of the school year a fellowship may be awarded to that member of the graduating class who has attended the full course of three years, and who is, in the judgment of the faculty, qualified by scholarship and other attainments to perform the duties of the office. Each fellow is appointed for one year, and

performs such duties as are assigned to him by the faculty, receiving for his services the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The fellowship for the class of 1929 was awarded to Dixon H. Geiser.

#### ORDER OF THE COIF

A chapter in the honorary Order of the Coif has been installed and members are elected each year from the upper tenth of the senior class.

#### LIBRARY FACILITIES

The School of Law maintains, adjacent to the classrooms, an adequate working library. A well-equipped and well-managed law library is maintained by Allegheny County in the City-County Building, close by, at public expense and open free to the public. A room is provided for law students, who have access to the whole library. The School of Law Library has the privilege of borrowing books from the County Law Library.

PERSONAL PROPERTY 2 hrs., 1st sem.

Distinction between personal and real property; nature of and rights based upon possession; some methods of acquiring title to chattels; liens and pledges; conversion; fixtures; emblements. A casebook course based on Bigelow's *Cases on Personal Property*.

REAL PROPERTY 2 hrs., 2d sem.

Historical introduction to real property; adverse possession; prescription; accretion; dedication. Bigelow's Introduction of Real Property; Aigler's Cases on Titles to Real Property.

CRIMINAL LAW 2 hrs., 1st sem.; 3 hrs., 2d sem.

Nature of crimes; intent and act; capacity to commit crimes and defenses thereto; historical development of crimes and statutory changes. Sayre's *Cases on Criminal Law*.

EQUITY 2 hrs., 2d sem.
